Time is set aside each day for relaxation, exercise, conversation, rest, and reflection.*

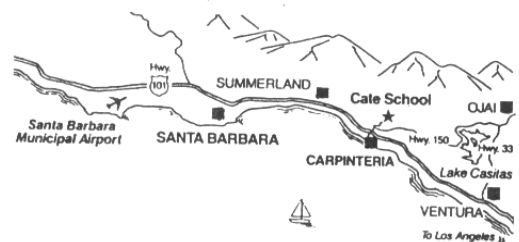
## CONFERENCE DIRECTORS

**Ellie Griffin** - Ellie is the Director of Health and Counseling Services at **Milton Academy**, a K-12 boarding/day school in Milton, Massachusetts, where she holds the Ronald C. Moir chair in counseling. She has developed counseling programs and overseen sexuality education, and human development programs for the past twenty-five years. She also teaches AP Psychology to seniors. Ellie has been a consultant and faculty trainer leading adult workshops on Human Development issues for numerous schools nationally and internationally and was published in the *Independent School Bulletin* for her research on self-esteem and identity in African-American and Hispanic young women. Ellie has also worked with the Mind/Body program in Boston to develop curriculum for their school initiative program teaching adolescents how to manage stress. Ellie also leads workshops for **Independent School Management** for Deans and for Women Administrators and is co-director of the **INDEPENDENT SCHOOL GENDER PROJECT**.

**Carol Hotchkiss** - Carol has 30 years of teaching, counseling, and administrative experience in independent schools. She is now Director of **THE DURANGO INSTITUTE FOR CO-CURRICULAR EDUCATION** in Durango, Colorado which offers workshops, consultation, and in-service training for schools on human development programs, residential life issues, student leadership, and support services. Carol is the author of *Quests and Quandaries*, a text for human development courses, co-author of *Building a Residential Curriculum* for boarding schools, and has published articles in several books and periodicals on school community and co-curricular education. Her new book, *Personal Quests and Quandaries: Stories and Self-Portraits*, will be available at this workshop. A popular speaker at national and regional conferences, Carol is a co-curricular consultant with schools across the US and Canada and is on the teaching faculty of **TABS**, *The Association of Boarding Schools* and co-director of the **INDEPENDENT SCHOOL GENDER PROJECT** with Ellie.

## CATE SCHOOL FACILITIES

Cate School is located on 150 acres between the Santa Ynez Mountains and the Pacific Ocean, overlooking the ocean and the Carpinteria Valley. The city of Santa Barbara is 12 miles to the north. Surrounded by chaparral, cactus, and, in the valley, lemon and avocado orchards, Cate is landscaped with wide lawns, tree and flowers. The conference will have full use of the campus and there will be opportunities for tennis squash, jogging, hiking, swimming in the Cate pool, or just enjoying the sun and ocean breezes. Dress for the conference will be informal and comfortable. (shorts, slacks, etc.) Participants will be housed in Cate's dormitories.



**Directions to Cate School:** From Highway 101, take the Casitas Pass Road exit in Carpinteria. Turn northeast (Toward the mountains) and proceed along Casitas Pass Road for 9/10 of a mile. At the stop sign, turn right and continue one mile to Lillingston Canyon Road; turn left. The entrance to Cate School is about 50 yards away. Follow signs for parking and registration.

If you are flying in to the conference, make your arrangements in to Santa Barbara airport, which is only 15 miles away.
